6 OVER YELLOW CREEK IN HOMER CITY BOROUGH, INDIANA COUNTY, AS
7 THE SGT. WALTER F. NOVAK MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A
8 BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 8706, ON THAT PORTION OF
9 STATE ROUTE 4021 OVER A TRIBUTARY OF THE WEST BRANCH OF THE
10 SUSQUEHANNA RIVER, SUSQUEHANNA TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, AS
11 THE PETTY OFFICER IRAL WILLIAM STOLTZ MEMORIAL BRIDGE;
12 DESIGNATING A BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 11523, ON THAT
13 PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 729 OVER MUDDY RUN, ON THE

20 MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE
21 KEY 67464, CARRYING STATE ROUTE 4019 OVER THE NORFOLK
22 SOUTHERN RAILWAY IN NORTH HUNTINGDON TOWNSHIP, WESTMORELAND
23 COUNTY, AS THE WWII VETERAN WARREN "BIZZ" WATSON MEMORIAL
24 BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 41673,
25 CARRYING STATE ROUTE 3102, ALSO KNOWN AS OAKRIDGE DRIVE, OVER
26 U.S. 219 IN RICHLAND TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, AS THE CAMBRIA
27 COUNTY VIETNAM VETERANS MEMORIAL BRIDGE; AND MAKING A RELATED
28 REPEAL.

29 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
30 hereby enacts as follows:

31 Section 1. Private John W. Coble Memorial Bridge.

32 (a) Findings.--The General Assembly finds and declares as
33 follows:

- 34 (1) John W. Coble was born May 6, 1912.
- 35 (2) Mr. Coble was married to Sarah Josephine Coble, and
36 they had six children: William Lucas Coble, Robert Harold
37 Coble, Barbara Louise Coble Partner, Kay Frances Meleshenko,
38 John Allan Coble and Rebecca Ann Holter.
- 39 (3) Mr. Coble entered Naval Service on May 12, 1944, and
40 was honorably discharged from the United States Navy on
41 November 18, 1945.
- 42 (4) Mr. Coble was a PennDOT employee who died while on
43 the job on June 19, 1972.

44 (b) Designation.--The bridge, identified as Bridge Key

1 41606, carrying State Route 3011, also known as Branch Road,
2 over Spring Creek in ~~Lemont~~ COLLEGE TOWNSHIP, Centre County, is <--
3 designated the Private John W. Coble Memorial Bridge.

4 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
5 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the bridge to
6 traffic in both directions on the bridge.

7 SECTION 2. CORPORAL WILLIAM T. COSTLOW, SR., MEMORIAL BRIDGE. <--

8 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
9 FOLLOWS:

10 (1) CORPORAL COSTLOW WAS BORN OCTOBER 12, 1928.

11 (2) CORPORAL COSTLOW ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES ARMY
12 IN JANUARY 1948 AT THE JOHNSTOWN RECRUITING STATION.

13 (3) CORPORAL COSTLOW COMPLETED HIS BASIC TRAINING IN
14 FORT KNOX, KENTUCKY, BEFORE GOING TO FORT LEWIS, WASHINGTON,
15 FOR ARMORED FORCES ADVANCED TRAINING.

16 (4) FOLLOWING THE COMPLETION OF TRAINING, CORPORAL
17 COSTLOW WAS SENT OVERSEAS IN JUNE 1950 FROM CAMP STONEMAN,
18 CALIFORNIA.

19 (5) IN SEPTEMBER 1950, CORPORAL COSTLOW WAS WOUNDED IN
20 ACTION.

21 (6) ON NOVEMBER 1, 1950, CORPORAL COSTLOW WAS CAPTURED
22 BY NORTH KOREAN FORCES JUST TWO WEEKS AFTER RETURNING FROM
23 HIS INJURY IN THE LINE OF DUTY.

24 (7) WHEN CAPTURED, CORPORAL COSTLOW WAS SERVING WITH THE
25 24TH DIVISION.

26 (8) WHILE CAPTURED, CORPORAL COSTLOW LIVED ON A NEAR-
27 STARVATION DIET CONSISTING OF MILLET, BARLEY, OLD CABBAGE AND
28 SOYBEAN SOUPS.

29 (9) CORPORAL COSTLOW WAS HELD AT PRISON CAMP 3, PUCKONY,
30 NORTH KOREA, FOR 33 MONTHS AS A PRISONER OF WAR.

1 (10) AFTER HIS RELEASE WAS NEGOTIATED, CORPORAL COSTLOW
2 WROTE TO HIS PARENTS AND ADVISED HIS PARENTS TO NOTIFY THE
3 FAMILY OF A FELLOW PRISONER OF WAR.

4 (11) AFTER HIS RELEASE, CORPORAL COSTLOW RETURNED HOME
5 TO ST. MICHAEL, CAMBRIA COUNTY.

6 (12) FOR HIS SERVICE TO THE UNITED STATES, CORPORAL
7 COSTLOW RECEIVED THE GOOD CONDUCT MEDAL, THE KOREAN SERVICE
8 MEDAL, THREE BRONZE SERVICE STARS, THE UNITED NATIONS SERVICE
9 MEDAL, THE NATIONAL DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL, THE DISTINGUISHED
10 UNIT EMBLEM, THE COMBAT INFANTRYMAN BADGE, THE MARKSMAN BADGE
11 AND A PURPLE HEART.

12 (13) CORPORAL COSTLOW PASSED AWAY DECEMBER 7, 2006.

13 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY 8536,
14 CARRYING PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 869, ALSO KNOWN AS LOCUST STREET,
15 OVER TOPPER RUN, LOCATED IN ADAMS TOWNSHIP, CAMBRIA COUNTY, IS
16 DESIGNATED THE CORPORAL WILLIAM T. COSTLOW, SR., MEMORIAL
17 BRIDGE.

18 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
19 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
20 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

21 SECTION 3. PFC ROBERT LEE QUICK MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

22 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
23 FOLLOWS:

24 (1) PRIVATE FIRST CLASS (PFC) ROBERT LEE QUICK WAS BORN
25 JUNE 15, 1949, IN PHILIPSBURG.

26 (2) PFC QUICK ATTENDED WEST BRANCH HIGH SCHOOL.

27 (3) PFC QUICK ENLISTED IN THE MARINES IN JULY 1967.

28 (4) PFC QUICK ARRIVED IN VIETNAM ON CHRISTMAS DAY 1967
29 AND SERVED AS A RIFLEMAN WITH THE 3RD SQUAD, 2ND PLATOON,
30 COMPANY K, 3RD BATTALION, 3RD MARINE DIVISION.

1 (5) ON FEBRUARY 7, 1968, PFC QUICK'S COMPANY WAS ENGAGED
2 IN ENEMY FIRE NEAR GIO LINH, IN THE QUANG TRI PROVINCE.

3 (6) A HAND GRENADE WAS THROWN INTO THE HOLE FROM WHICH
4 PFC QUICK AND HIS COMPANY WERE ENGAGING.

5 (7) PFC QUICK HEROICALLY GRABBED THE GRENADE AND
6 ATTEMPTED TO THROW THE GRENADE OUT OF THE HOLE.

7 (8) THE GRENADE DETONATED PRIOR TO LEAVING HIS LEFT HAND
8 KILLING PFC QUICK INSTANTLY.

9 (9) PFC QUICK WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE NAVY CROSS
10 AND THE PURPLE HEART.

11 (10) PFC QUICK WAS 18 YEARS OLD WHEN HE WAS KILLED IN
12 THE LINE OF DUTY ON FEBRUARY 7, 1968.

13 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
14 11656, CARRYING STATE ROUTE 1009, ALSO KNOWN AS POWELL STREET,
15 OVER EMIGH RUN IN MORRIS TOWNSHIP, CLEARFIELD COUNTY, IS
16 DESIGNATED THE PFC ROBERT LEE QUICK MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

17 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
18 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
19 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

20 SECTION 4. KENNETH C. DEPOE, DFCA, BRIDGE.

21 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
22 FOLLOWS:

23 (1) KENNETH C. DEPOE HAS BEEN INSTRUMENTAL IN LOCAL
24 CONSERVATION SINCE THE EARLY 1960S, STARTING A FLY TYING CLUB
25 AT DONEGAL HIGH SCHOOL IN 1961 AND SHORTLY BEGAN STREAM
26 IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS ON THE DONEGAL CREEK WITH HIS STUDENTS.

27 (2) MR. DEPOE HELPED ESTABLISH BOTH THE DONEGAL FISH AND
28 CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION IN 1965 AND THE DONEGAL CHAPTER OF
29 TROUT UNLIMITED IN 1967, SERVING AS ITS FIRST PRESIDENT.

30 (3) MR. DEPOE WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN ESTABLISHING A

1 COOPERATIVE TROUT NURSERY WITH THE PENNSYLVANIA FISH AND BOAT
2 COMMISSION, ONE OF THE OLDEST COOPERATIVE NURSERIES IN THIS
3 COMMONWEALTH, RAISING 3,500 TROUT ANNUALLY.

4 (4) BECAUSE OF MR. DEPOE'S LEADERSHIP AND CONSERVATION
5 EFFORTS, A TWO-MILE STRETCH OF THE RECLAIMED DONEGAL CREEK
6 WAS OFFICIALLY DESIGNATED AS A CATCH AND RELEASE FLY-FISHING-
7 ONLY STREAM AND BECAME INCLUDED IN THE STATE'S STOCKING
8 PROGRAM.

9 (5) MR. DEPOE WAS ACTIVE IN THE DONEGAL FISH AND
10 CONSERVATION ASSOCIATION FOR OVER 40 YEARS, SERVING AS CLUB
11 PRESIDENT FOR OVER 30 YEARS, LEADING IMPROVEMENT PROJECTS ON
12 DONEGAL CREEK AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A KID'S FISHING DERBY.

13 (6) THROUGH MR. DEPOE'S EFFORT, DONEGAL CREEK IS A TROUT
14 STREAM RECOGNIZED IN SEVERAL BOOKS AND MAGAZINE ARTICLES
15 DEDICATED TO TROUT AND FLY FISHING.

16 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE, IDENTIFIED AS BRIDGE KEY
17 68567, LOCATED ON THAT PORTION OF PENNSYLVANIA ROUTE 772 OVER
18 DONEGAL CREEK, EAST DONEGAL TOWNSHIP, LANCASTER COUNTY, IS
19 DESIGNATED THE KENNETH C. DEPOE, DFCA, BRIDGE.

20 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
21 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
22 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.

23 SECTION 5. A1C ROBERT P. PAPE MEMORIAL BRIDGE.

24 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
25 FOLLOWS:

26 (1) ROBERT P. PAPE WAS BORN FEBRUARY 25, 1949, IN
27 PUNXSUTAWNEY.

28 (2) AIRMAN FIRST CLASS (A1C) PAPE WAS A LIFELONG
29 RESIDENT OF PUNXSUTAWNEY AND A MEMBER OF THE SAINTS COSMAS
30 AND DAMIAN CHURCH.

1 (3) A1C PAPE ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE ON
2 NOVEMBER 13, 1968.
